# The Structure of Words

### **Sound:** What the word and parts of the word *sound* like

Whole sound: crush

crushed crushing

Parts: syllables - crush/ crushed/ crush/ing

individual phonemes 'k' 'r' 'u' 'sh'

'k' 'r' 'u' 'sh' 't' 'k' 'r' 'u' 'sh' 'i' 'ng'

### **Image:** What the word and parts of the word *look* like

Whole image: cat

horse goat mouse

Parts – graphemes c a †

h or se g oa t m ou se

## **Structure:** Why the word looks the way it does

**Whole image:** Meaning of the whole word and sequence of letters to spell it:

eject

Parts: Morphemes

sequence of letters and meaning of the morphemes

e – out of **ject** – to throw **greatest** (est meaning the most),

florist (ist meaning a person who does...)

ed ending – meaning past tense (jumped, banged, started)

#### Spelling rules and conventions

Spelling patterns influence pronunciation (orange)

complete - e\_e signifies long vowel

se/cret, bu/qle, bi/ble - single vowel at end of syllable signifies

open syllable – long vowel pronunciation

running – nn signifies single vowel preceding it will be short
